- People who live in residential /nursing care settings
- People in receipt of a carer's allowance o those who are the main carer for an elderly or disabled person whose welfare may be at risk if the carer falls ill

Uptake of flu vaccine in people aged 65 years and over in Darlington for 2006/07 was 75%. Figures for England stood at 74%.



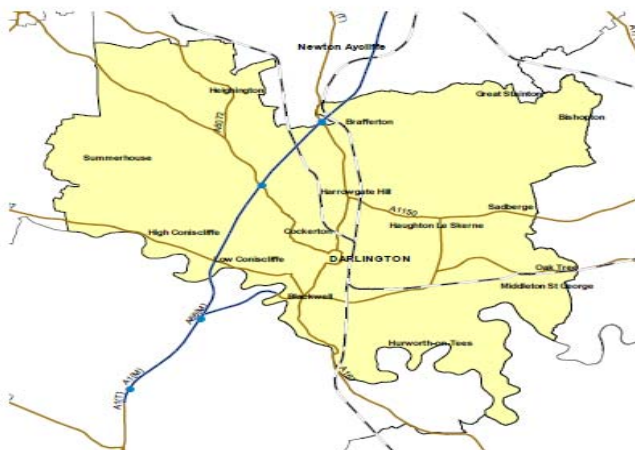

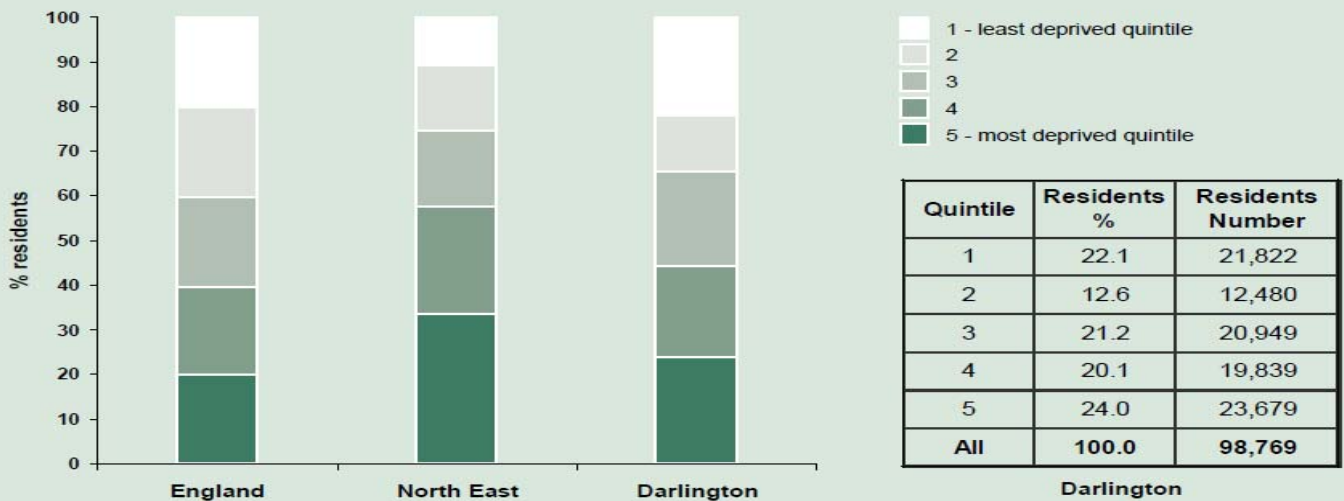
Darlington at a glance

- Nearly a quarter of the residents of Darlington live in the most deprived areas of England and just under a quarter of residents live in the least deprived areas. Early deaths from heart disease and stroke and early deaths from cancer are not significantly different from the England average, but life expectancy for both males and females is worse than the England average.
- Men from the least deprived areas of Darlington live ten years longer than those from the most deprived areas, and the difference for women is seven years.
- Over the last ten years, death rates from all causes have gradually decreased for men and women, but remain worse than the England average. Early deaths from heart disease and stroke have decreased markedly, especially over the last four years. Early deaths from cancer have changed slightly.
- In Darlington, the percentage of mothers smoking in pregnancy, the rate of teenage pregnancy and rate of hospital stays for alcohol related harm are worse than the England average.
- The percentage of physically active adults, percentage of obese children in reception and deaths from smoking are not significantly different from the England averages.
- Darlington's health priorities are smoking, alcohol, obesity and sexual health, together with partnership work to tackle the wider determinants of health.

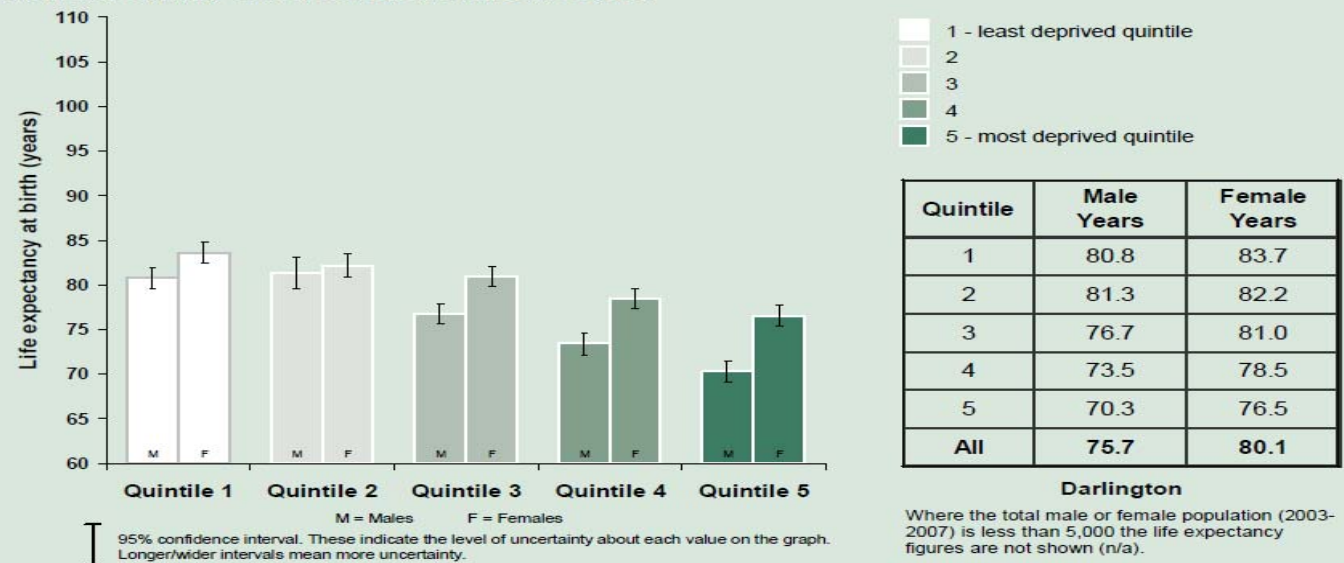
Deprivation

This chart shows the proportion of residents within England, the region and the local authority living in neighbourhoods belonging to each of the five national deprivation quintiles. These quintiles were derived by arranging all the small areas (Lower Super Output Areas) in England in rank order according to the deprivation scores in the Index of Multiple Deprivation 2007 and dividing them into five equal groupings. The resident numbers are based on the 2005 population figures.

Health inequalities: changes over time

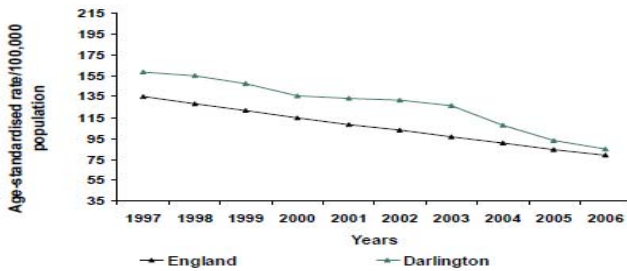

Trend 1 compares death rates (at all ages and from all causes) in this local authority with those for England.

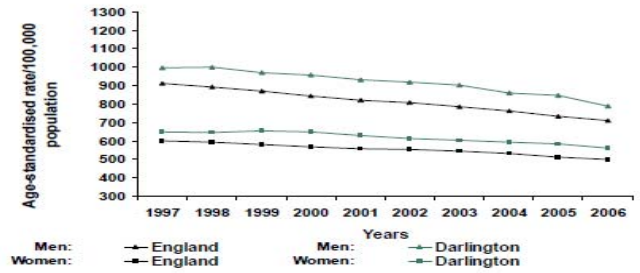
Trend 2 compares rates of early death from heart disease and stroke (in people under 75) in this local authority with those for England.

Trend 3 compares rates of early death from cancer (in people under 75) in this local authority with those for England.

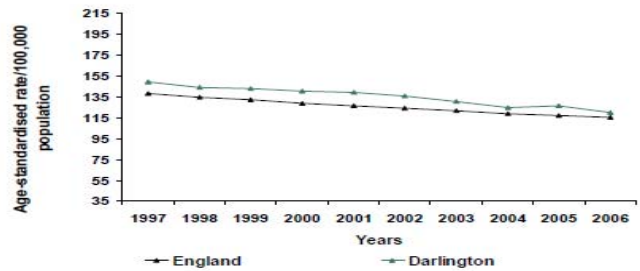
Trend 2:

All age, all cause mortality

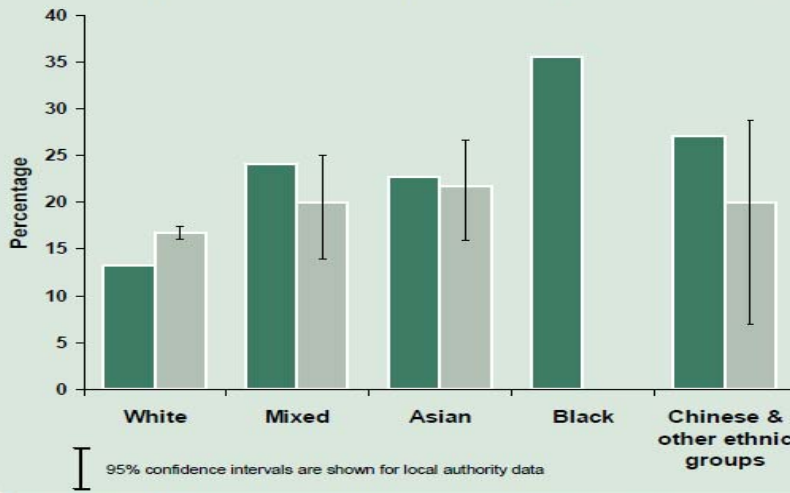


Trend 3:

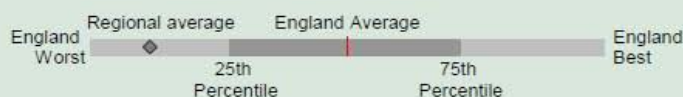
