TV Licence

Travel

Blue Badges (Parking Badges for Disabled People)

You can apply for a car badge if you are registered blind, or if you receive certain disability benefits. If you are not registered blind or do not receive certain benefits but do have limited sight or have an illness or disability that limits your mobility, you may still be entitled to a car badge.

Concessionary Bus Pass

If you are registered blind/severely sight impaired or partially sighted /sight impaired and/or are of pensionable age, you may be entitled to a concessionary bus pass.



Disabled Persons Railcard

If you are registered as visually impaired, you can apply for the railcard which gives you a 33% discount on all fares. If another adult travels with you, they can also receive the same discount.

Rail Travel Assistance

Arrangements can be made for disabled passengers including arranging for staff to meet you at your departure station, accompanying you to the train and seeing you safely on board. Similar arrangements can be made at your destination station and other stations if you need to change trains.
