



Darlington Alternative Education Provision Framework Catalogue (September 2021 – July 2024)

For use by primary and secondary schools in Darlington

Introduction

The Framework Agreement for Alternative Education Provision is primarily part of the delivery of education to Key Stage 4 young people in Darlington and will particularly support vulnerable young people.

From September 2024 the Alternative Education Provision Framework (*the Framework*) includes providers meeting the needs of vulnerable pupils in Key Stages 2 and 3.

The Framework will improve outcomes through:

- Clear and consistent terms and conditions for all providers, in line with statutory requirements, guidance on alternative provision and local agreed practice.
- Improved arrangements for safeguarding the welfare of young people.
- Clarity on the responsibilities of all parties (schools, Local Authority, and providers)
- Improved quality assurance and monitoring arrangements.
- Clear and consistent costs against outcomes, supporting the duty to deliver value for money.
- Improved engagement with the market of alternative education providers, supporting innovation, sustainability of providers and improved provision to meet needs.
- Improved operational and strategic partnerships with and between providers to improve outcomes for young people.

The Framework is specifically for use by schools in Darlington and therefore operates within this prescribed remit and completely independently to any other commissioning activity. As this contracting arrangement operates on a non-exclusivity basis, providers operating on the Framework may also provide services through other contracting arrangements to meet broader commissioning requirements including, but not limited to; children's social care commissioning and SEND commissioning.

The Framework does not cover provision currently provided by or co-ordinated through the Local Authority's Pupil Referral Unit and the Home and Hospital Teaching Service. The following provisions are also outside of the scope of the Framework:



- Any form of regulated residential provision including short breaks (both within the borough of Darlington and out of the authority)
- Post compulsory educational provision for 16-19 year olds

Use of the Framework

The Framework does not guarantee work for any provider. It is a list of approved providers for the placing by schools of individual young people or groups through a 'call off' process.

The requirements of the Framework will mean that schools will have to sign up to purchase from the Framework providers. Exceptionally, schools may need to purchase alternative educational provision from providers outside of the Framework; this must only be where specialist provision or curriculum provision is not available from the list. However, in such cases, the referring school must ensure that the provider they choose meets all the necessary requirements laid out in the original tender and they make the appropriate contracting arrangements.

In choosing provision the referring school must:

1. Choose the best provider to meet the student's needs (e.g., curriculum offer, personal and social needs)
2. Make a referral to this provider
3. If this provider is unable to take the referral, move to the next most suitable provider on the list
4. Once a referral is agreed, confirm the learning plan and complete the Agreement

Provider checks

The Education Partnerships team, on behalf of the Partnership, will arrange regular health & safety checks, safeguarding checks and quality assurance monitoring of providers. However, this does not remove or affect any of the statutory obligations and duties upon schools in relation to the provision of education or the exclusion of young people from the school, or from any local agreements.

Any pupil placed by a school in alternative education provision remains on the roll of that school, and responsibility for delivering the full-time statutory education offer and all other duties in respect of that pupil remains with the school. Where a pupil or group of pupils is engaged in a programme, whether on or off-site, they remain the responsibility of the school.

Specifically, the commissioning school remains responsible for the monitoring and tracking of progress of individual pupils and their attendance in co-operation with the provider, where appropriate using the Darlington Collaborative Protocols.

If the placement of a pupil is at risk for any reason, then the provider must meet with the commissioning school at the earliest opportunity to discuss issues and plan a way forward.

The following agreement should be used by schools to purchase alternative education provision with agreed providers as listed in this catalogue.

No school should purchase full-time alternative provision from a single provider unless that provider is registered as an independent school. An independent school is defined as any organisation at which full-time education is provided for five or more pupils of compulsory school age, or one or more such pupils with an EHC plan or a statement of special educational needs or who is “looked after” by the local authority and is not a school maintained by a local authority or a non-maintained special school.

Brief description of the programme:

Since 2011 Academy21 has delivered live interactive online learning that focuses on good academic outcomes, pastoral support, mental health and wellbeing strategies and academic mentoring. In the 2021-2022 academic year, we supported over 1,200 young people across schools within 120+ local authority areas throughout England and Wales.

Academy21 works exclusively with vulnerable learners who are unable to cope with or attend a mainstream school setting and need alternative education to support their progression. It supports learners on a short term (interim) basis through to meeting longer term needs and offers school and local authority services a range of flexible commissioning and academically focused course options that do not require block booking or long- term budget commitments and there are no minimum or maximum purchasing requirements.

The children/young people referred to Academy21 remain on roll locally with all attendance, engagement and progress data provided 24/7 to the designated school or local authority officer via our online reporting systems. Dedicated regional teams with named staff members are available to advise, guide and support ensuring a personalised approach is offered to each referral received and throughout each young person’s time with Academy21.

*PAYG can be commissioned on a weekly basis and is invoiced monthly in arrears. It is typically used for short term/interim/day 6 provision but can be utilised for longer term needs. The placement can be cancelled with 5 working days-notice, thereby removing budget risk should circumstances change for the young person referred.

Daily cost per pupil:

We charge on a weekly basis but for comparative purposes a student studying KS4 Maths and English with us for one week would receive 10 hours of learning in that week at an equivalent daily cost ranging from £18.40/day to £22.40/day (dependent on the commissioning option taken).

Other relevant information (minimum or maximum group size, etc.):

Academy21 can accept referrals at any point during the year. Referrals are made by the commissioning organisation via our online referral form with the process typically taking no more than 2 working days. We only accept referrals from Schools, Education Organisations, and the Local Authority. Each referral should have a completed enrolment form and any supporting information on the child/young person being referred.
