To help you decide which course will suit you, the following definitions explain each level of study and will help you choose according to your existing level of knowledge and experience:

Pre Entry Level - This course is designed for those with no or very little basic skills and knowledge. The small class settings and additional support prepares the individuals to progress to Entry Level 1.

Entry level - Beginners, Introductory courses - Courses designed for those who wish to gain basic knowledge and skills. Qualifications are offered at Entry 1, Entry 2 and Entry 3 in a range of subject areas including English and Maths.

Level 1 - Intermediate courses - Courses designed for those who may have studied or gained a qualification some time ago. These courses provide a foundation to progress to advanced courses. Equivalent to NVQ 1, GCSE grades 1 to 3.

Level 2 - Courses for those reasonably confident in their skills and knowledge and want to learn, apply and interpret information about the subject or skill. Equivalent to NVQ 2, GCSE grades 4 to 9.

Level 3 - Courses for those who want to explore a subject in detail, with some independent research and reflection of the subject. Equivalent to NVQ 3, AS/A2 Level.

Level 4/5 - Courses for learners who want an in-depth knowledge of current issues and how they apply to the wider environment. Equivalent to an A Level, Professional Certificates and Awards, Certificate of Higher Education and Foundation Degree.

Pre-Employment Study Programmes

Study Programmes are a range of pre-employment courses for 16-18 year olds in the Darlington and Tees Valley area that enable them to develop their personal, social and employability skills in a small and friendly environment that suits their way of learning. The courses allow young people to gain work experience with an employer to increase their chances of gaining employment, further training or an Apprenticeship. Learners will also increase their maths, English and ICT skills too.

Diplomas for 16-18 year olds

Level 2 Diplomas are offered to 16-18 year olds in Motor Vehicle Mechanics, Customer Service and Business Administration. Diplomas last up to an academic year and allow the learner to study different aspects of their chosen area whilst gaining a recognised qualification. These diplomas can be used as part of an apprenticeship or as a standalone qualification.

These diplomas will involve some work experience with a local employer chosen by the learner, and they may enable them to gain further industry qualifications such as a CSCS card, First Aid and more. If required, we'll also help learners with their English and maths skills to support their progression.

Apprenticeships

If you are ready to commit to both work and study, then an Apprenticeship is for you. Apprenticeships allow you to gain practical real-life experience, developing transferable skills and earning a wage. Apprenticeships have developed significantly over the years and there is now the opportunity to study Apprenticeship standards. Most employers will look for you to have GCSE grade 4/C or above in maths and English, although it is not solely based on academic achievement and will ultimately be up to the employer. The delivery methods of each Apprenticeship differ a great deal, as does each Apprenticeship offered.

The duration of the Apprenticeships below includes an additional End Point Assessment (EPA) planning period, normally 3 months. The EPA is the final assessment, which is independently assessed, and used to showcase the knowledge, skills and behaviours developed over the duration of the Apprenticeship.

All employers receive an incentive payment of £1,000 for employing an apprentice aged between 16-18 or an apprentice aged between 19 and 24 years old with an Education, Health and Care plan. Additional incentives based on criteria such as geographical and vocational area may also be available.

Apprenticeships

Taking on an Apprentice is a fantastic way to develop your workforce and increase the productivity of your business, whilst not affecting your bottom line. An Apprenticeship is a genuine job which combines practical training in a job with study. The Apprentice will be aged 16+, be paid at least the National Minimum wage for Apprentices and have a contract of employment for a minimum of 30 hours per week.

The Apprentice will gain new experiences and develop their knowledge, skills and behaviours whilst in the workplace, alongside being supported from industry expert trainers through our training sites. Apprentices are just starting out their career and so are an enthusiastic and a valuable addition to your team. With some great government funded financial incentives there really is no better time to consider hiring an apprentice.

Diploma Courses and Study Programmes

We are also looking for employers to support the Study Programmes and Diploma courses by enabling us to offer short and long term work experience to young people aged 16 -18. The work experience could be anything from one week to 12 months and it would enable the young person to gain vital skills and knowledge in their chosen area, as well as develop their work ethic and transferable skills.

The work experience would be for 16 - 18 year olds from a range of backgrounds who are trying to access further education, employment or an Apprenticeship. They will have committed interest in their chosen area of work and will be supported by our training staff throughout their experience. Any specific needs will be discussed at the outset, so that you can decide if the learner would be suitable for your business.

The work experience is on a voluntary basis with no cost to the placement, such as wages and PPE. Functional Skills and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

Functional Skills are the fundamental skills you need for your working and personal lives. We offer Functional Skills courses to improve your skills and confidence in reading, writing, using numbers, and using computers. You will learn in a friendly and supportive environment and at pace to suit your needs. Functional Skills can be used to improve your employment opportunities or to move up the ladder at work. Courses run throughout the academic year and you can sign up for a free initial assessment today! Further details can be found on our website.

Functional Skills Maths

We can help you with the basics of maths from addition and subtraction to multiplication, division and times tables. You will work towards understanding decimals, percentages, fractions, money and time, measurement, areas, perimeter, volume, ratios and much more.

Functional Skills English

We can help you with the basics of English with a particular focus on reading and writing, speaking and listening and punctuation and

grammar. You will work towards understanding tenses and verbs and you will work on your spelling, proof reading, the use of apostrophes and commas, and much more.

Functional Skills and ESOL courses are free of charge

ESOL

ESOL courses are entry level English language courses designed for those who do not have English as their first language. They will help to develop communication skills for everyday situations and have the opportunity to work with other learners and make new friends from many different countries. ESOL will boost an individual's confidence and help them to read, write and speak clearly in English.

We offer ESOL from Pre-Entry level (very basic beginners) all the way up to Level 1. Courses are offered on a variety of days, times and venues across Darlington, including morning, afternoon and evening classes. We even run ESOL community courses throughout the summer holidays too so learning English never stops for those who need it most.

ESOL courses are free of charge subject to the following eligibility criteria:

- The individual must be aged 19+ and reside in Darlington, or within commuting distance of Darlington
- They must have been living in the UK for at least 6 months*
- They are a refugee, or
- They are claiming asylum and have permission from the home office to access work, education and training, or
- They have been in the UK for the previous three years and have the right to live and work in the UK
- * the 6 month waiting period does not apply to Ukrainian nationals

We have previously used ESOL to help Syrian and Afghan refugees, and most recently Ukrainian nationals fleeing the conflict in their home country, to learn English.

Before attending a Functional Skills or ESOL course you must complete an initial assessment to check your current working level. Assessments are held both online and in-centre at the Coleridge Centre (excluding holidays and bank holidays).

Distance Learning



Choose from a wide range of accredited qualifications to develop your career or enhance your employment prospects. Learn something new, different and useful or improve your existing skills to kickstart your career or learning journey.

Level 3 Award in Education and Training

This course is perfect for you if you want to teach in the Lifelong Learning Sector or if you are a trainer or tutor who has no formal teaching qualifications.

The course will give you an insight into:

- The roles and responsibilities of a teacher
- The role of the assessor
- Teaching methods and assessments
- Learning styles
- Establishing ground rules
- Embedding functional skills into lesson plans





Course Costs and Reduced Fees

Full Fees (including enrolment and tuition fees): £3.00 per hour

Accredited Learning: Full accreditation fee (if applicable) - if the course has a qualification there will be additional fees to pay for registration and certification.

No fees will be charged for publicly subsidised courses where:

- 1. Learners are aged 16-18 (on 31st August 2023)
- 2. Learners are aged 19-24 (on 31st August 2023) with a learning difficulty and / or disability as evidenced through an Education, Health and Care (EHC) Plan or Learning Difficulty Assessment (LDA)
- 3. Learners are aged 19 or over:
 - a. Where the learning aim is up to and including Level 2, and the learner is studying English or Maths delivered as a qualification required as part of the legal entitlements
 - b. Where they have not already achieved a full level 3 qualification and wish to embark on completing one
- 4. Learners are aged 19-23 (on their first day of study) and are studying their first 'full' level 2. Excludes English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) delivered as a qualification required as part of the legal entitlements
- 5. Learners are aged 19 or older where the learning aim is up to and including level 2 (including ESOL), the skills training will help them into work, and the learner is classed as unemployed and one or more of the following apply:
 - a. receive Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA), including those receiving National Insurance credits only
 - b. receive Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
 - c. receive Universal Credit (UC), and their take-home pay as recorded on their UC statement (disregarding UC payments and other benefits) is less than £617 a month (learner is sole adult in their benefit claim) or £988 a month (learner has a joint benefit claim with their partner)
 - d. are released on temporary licence, studying outside a prison environment, and not funded by the Ministry of Justice
- 6. Learners are aged 19 or older where the learning aim is up to and including level 2 (including ESOL), they are employed and eligible for co-funding but earns less than £20,319 annual gross salary if living outside of the Tees Valley Combined Authority, or £27,040 annual gross salary if living in the Tees Valley Combined Authority and on the assumption of a 37.5 hour contract with paid statutory holiday entitlement.

Evidence to be seen: A wage slip within 3 months of the learning start date, or a current employment contract which states gross monthly/annual wages

- 7. Learners aged 19-24 who are unemployed and on a Traineeship
- 8. Learners that are have not achieved a full level 3 qualification, or above, in line with the government guidance can enrol on the level 3 Free Courses For Jobs (FCFJ) qualifications approved for funding if they are:
 - a. are 19 or over and do not already have a level 3 qualification
 - b. already have a level 3 qualification or higher but earn below the National Living Wage annually (£20,319 from April 2023)
 - c. already have a level 3 qualification or higher but are unemployed

Courses with no public subsidy:

For learners aged 19 or above and where the learning aim is level 3 or above (expect for exclusion above), learners will need to take out an Advanced Learning Loan, subject to funding availability. Further details can be found at: www.gov.uk/advanced-learning-loans

Asylum Seekers - individuals will be assessed for eligibility in conjunction with SFA guidance Special fees - some courses have special fees, cost on application FE course - NVQ etc price on application

Additional Learning Support (ALS) is intended to enable disadvantaged learners to achieve their learning goal by providing funding, on top of programme funds, to help them overcome their barriers to learning. The funding is intended to be flexible and to help support learners who have a range of learning difficulties and / or disabilities.
