MYP (Member of Youth Parliament)

Over the last couple of months, four young people, Stephen, Jack J, Charlie and Jack P, have been working hard campaigning for votes to become the next Member of Youth Parliament (MYP) for Darlington. During this time, they have also been campaigning for Make Your Mark (MYM) votes which is a nation-wide consultation where young people aged 11-18 can have their say on what is important to them. 12 schools across Darlington were part of MYP and MYM and a total of 7,927 votes were collected. These votes will be used to direct changes within Darlington and across the UK. On Monday 25 March, members of the council came to a count night in which Stephen Adenuga was voted as the new MYP for Darlington with Jack James acting as deputy. Leaving Care Larder (Fare Share)

Fare Share fights hunger and food waste by redistributing surplus food to frontline services. This support arrives at Pease House every Monday and is available for young people who find themselves a little short and need some food. MOMO is slowly being rolled out across Children's Services. In the first instance, the Looked After Through Care team are going to champion it with the plan of driving it forward once embedded. Mentoring programme

We have appointed 15 peer mentors who are currently going through the employee process. The service will provide a caring and responsive mentoring and befriending service to children and young people cared for by Darlington. We will be working with children and young people to address their social and emotional needs, improve their well-being and access to positive activities and opportunities.

Regional Children in Care Council

Safe Space

The Safe Space project is officially underway, and we are currently delivering sessions every other Tuesday in the YMCA Hub. The aim of the session is to work with children in care of a secondary school age, who are identified as needing some extra support and guidance. Going forward, a Friday session is being planned to focus on intervention work with partners, to support the different needs of the young people involved in the project.
