Darlington Borough Council in exercise of its powers under 32, 33 and 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as 'the Act') and of all other enabling powers; and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act hereby make the following Order.

**PART 1
DARLINGTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

CONSOLIDATION ORDER 2019**

1. The Darlington Borough Council (On Street Parking Places) Consolidation Order 2019 (as amended) ('the On Street Parking Places 2019') is amended as follows:
 - 1.1 The interpretation set out in Schedule One to this Order is added to the interpretations set out in article 2 of the On Street Parking Places 2019
 - 1.2 The articles set out in Schedule Two to this Order are deleted from the On Street Parking Places 2019 and replaced by the articles set out in Schedule Three to this Order

**PART 2
GENERAL**

2. This Order is entitled the Darlington Borough Council Road Traffic Restrictions (Amendment No.4) Order 2024 and shall come into effect on the

SCHEDULE ONE

**INTERPRETATION ADDED TO ARTICLE 2
ON STREET PARKING PLACES ORDER 2019**

“mobile phone payment” means a payment by debit or credit card made by mobile phone to the number displayed adjacent to a Pay and Display Parking Place allowing the vehicle to be parked for the period of time for which payment has been made, to be used where such facility is advertised and provided for that Pay and Display Parking Place

SCHEDULE TWO

**ARTICLES DELETED FROM
ON STREET PARKING PLACES ORDER 2019**

19. Subject to Part 3(B) and Article 27 of this Order no person shall leave or cause any vehicle to be left in the Pay and Display Parking Places during the charging hours except upon the payment of the parking charge and the display of the ticket purchased in the relevant position for the whole of the period of parking

20. The parking charge shall be payable at the time of leaving the vehicle in the Pay and Display Parking Place by the insertion of the appropriate coin or coins or a credit/debit card (at such ticket machines which indicate that the facility to pay by credit/debit card is available) into a ticket machine and thereby purchasing a ticket

21. A vehicle waiting in a Pay and Display Parking Place must have a valid ticket and/or permit displayed in the relevant position for the whole time that the vehicle is waiting in the Pay and Display Parking Place during the charging hours

26. Where all the ticket machines at a Pay and Display Parking Place carry notices placed upon them by a person duly authorised by the Council indicating that they are out of order a vehicle shall be exempt from the payment of the parking charge for the remainder of the charging hours for that day.

SCHEDULE THREE

**ARTICLES ADDED TO
ON STREET PARKING PLACES ORDER 2019**

19. Subject to Part 3(B) and Article 27 of this Order no person shall leave or cause any vehicle to be left in a Pay and Display Parking Place during the charging hours except upon the payment of the parking charge for the whole of the period of parking

20. The parking charge shall be payable at the time of leaving the vehicle in the Pay and Display Parking Place:

(1) by the insertion of the appropriate coin or coins into a ticket machine or by using a credit/debit card (at such ticket machines which indicate that the facility to pay by credit/debit card is available) and thereby purchasing a ticket; or

(2) by mobile phone payment (where such facility is available in the said Pay and Display Parking Place).

21. A vehicle waiting in a Pay and Display Parking Place must have a valid ticket and/or permit displayed in the relevant position for the whole time that the vehicle is waiting in the Pay and Display Parking Place during the charging hours, or have made a mobile phone payment (where such facility is available in the said Pay and Display Parking Place).

26. Where all the ticket machines at a Pay and Display Parking Place carry notices placed upon them by a person duly authorised by the Council indicating that they are out of order a vehicle shall be exempt from the payment of the parking charge for the remainder of the charging hours for that day PROVIDED THAT where a mobile phone payment has been made no refund of that payment shall be due from the Council.
