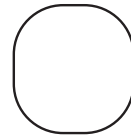
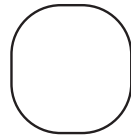
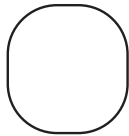
Start your trail in the Market Place.

Can you find all of them?

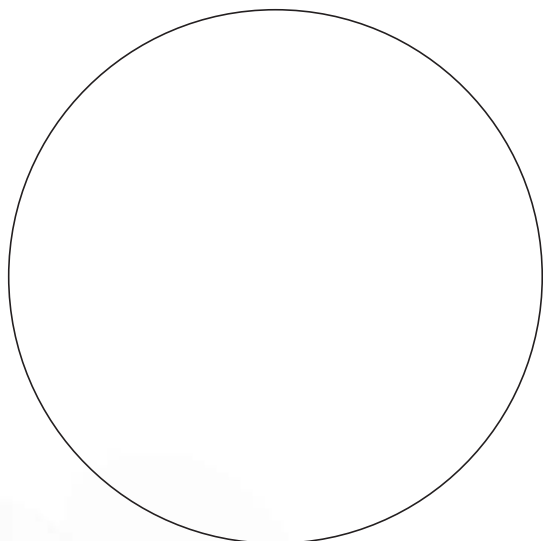
Copies of Locomotion Number 1's wheels have been used as decoration.

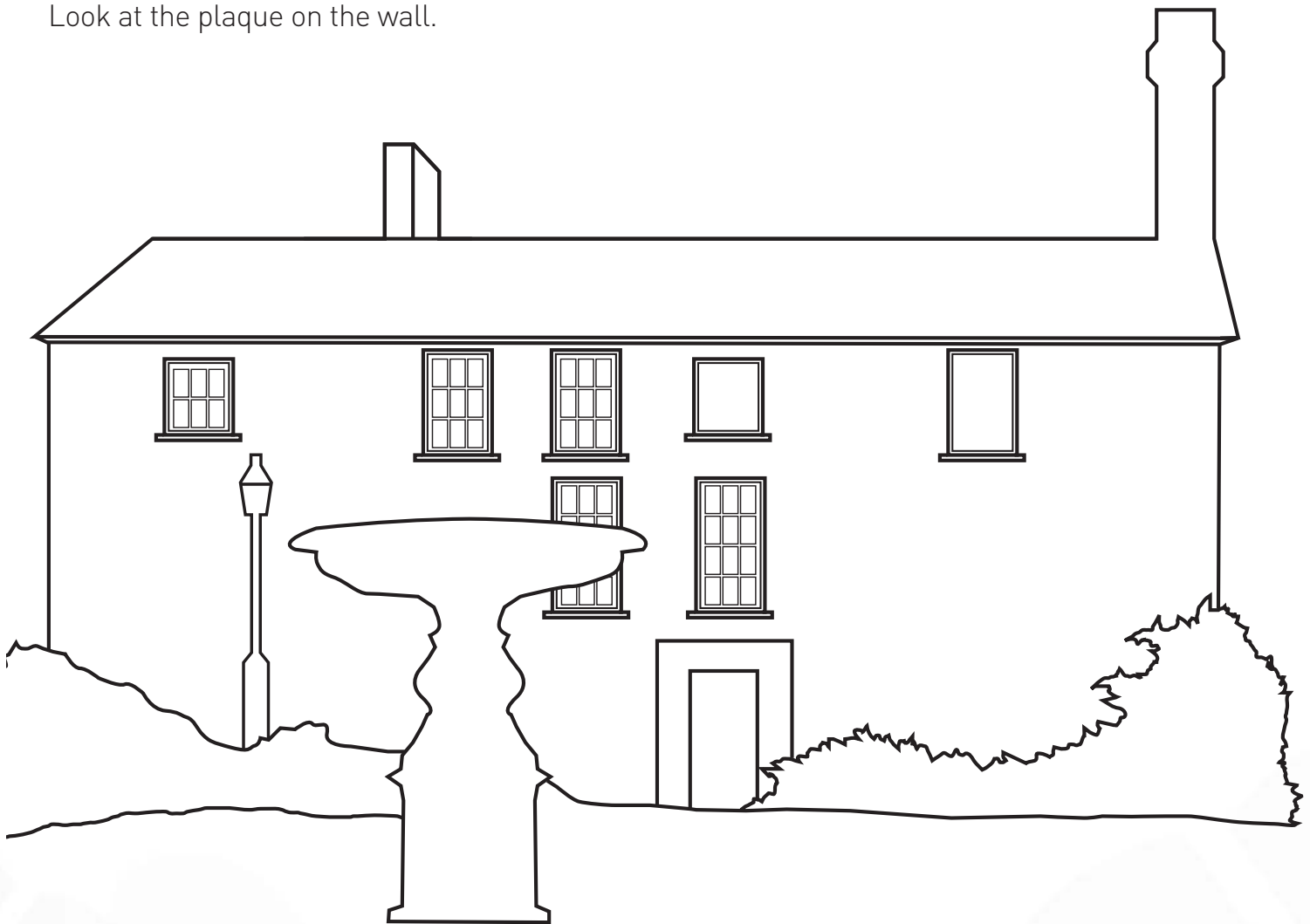


Go into Bull Wynd.
