Darlington hosted the first occasion on which a steam locomotive was used to haul passengers on a public railway.



The locomotive, Stephenson's 'Locomotion' still exists and is displayed at Head of Steam – Darlington Railway Museum.

> 1825 Skerne Bridge - Darlington hosts the oldest working railway bridge in the world. For most of the 1990s it featured on the back of the £5 note with Locomotion No. I passing over it at the opening of the Stockton and Darlington Railway.

5 BANK of ENGLAND FIVE POUNDS

Edward Pease

(1767–1858), a woollen manufacturer from Darlington, was the main promoter of the Stockton and Darlington Railway. He is often referred to as the "Father of the Railways". At his house he brokered the deal with George Stephenson on the 1st ever passenger railway in the world.
