- Purpose: If you have a hearing impairment, Adult Social Care can provide an assessment for hearing equipment, information, and advice on support available. You can also request an assessment for social care support.

Hearing Impairment Services

Purpose: A hearing impairment assessment can be carried out to identify what equipment or support you might need. This may include doorbells, alarm clocks and equipment for the television and telephone. Adult Social Care keep a register of people who are deaf and hearing impaired and can provide advice on how you can become registered. Registration enables you to receive discounts for certain leisure and travel activities.
